This British Standard reproduces verbatim ISO 10302:1996 and implements it as the UK national standard. It partially supersedes BS 848-2:1985 which will be withdrawn on publication of the suite of ISO standards which, together, cover the scope of BS 848-2:1985. The suite of future standards which will eventually complete the supersession are as follows:

- BS 848-2.6:** *Airborne noise emitted by small air-moving devices* (implementation of ISO 10302:1996)
