This British Standard is the UK implementation of EN 60670-24:2013+A11:2023. It is derived from IEC 60670-24:2011. It supersedes BS EN 60670-24:2013, which will be withdrawn on 5 May 2026.

The CENELEC common modifications have been implemented at the appropriate places in the text. The start and finish of each common modification is indicated in the text by **[C]** **⟨C⟩**.

The start and finish of text introduced or altered by amendment A11 is indicated in the text by tags. Tags indicating changes to text carry the number of the CENELEC amendment. For example, text altered by CENELEC amendment A11 is indicated by **[A11]** **⟨A11⟩**.
