This British Standard is the English language version of EN 61136-1:1995. It was derived by CENELEC from IEC 1136-1:1992.

The CENELEC common modifications have been implemented at the appropriate places in the text and are indicated by a sideline in the margin.

The UK participation in its preparation was entrusted to Technical Committee PEL/22, Static power converters, which has the responsibility to:

- aid enquirers to understand the text;
- present to the responsible international/European committee any enquiries on the interpretation, or proposals for change, and keep the UK interests informed;
- monitor related international and European developments and promulgate them in the UK.

From 1 January 1997, all IEC publications have the number 60000 added to the old number. For instance, IEC 27-1 has been renumbered as IEC 60027-1. For a period of time during the change over from one numbering system to the other, publications may contain identifiers from both systems.
