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Foreword

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Draft International Standards adopted by the technical committees are circulated to the member bodies for approval before their acceptance as International Standards by the ISO Council.

International Standard ISO 1750 was developed by Technical Committee ISO/TC 81, *Common names for pesticides and other agrochemicals*.

This International Standard cancels and replaces ISO Recommendation R 1750-1970 and its Addenda 1 to 5. It also incorporates draft Addenda 6, 7 and 8, which were circulated to the member bodies in December 1972.
