Foreword

ISO (the International Organization for Standardization) is a worldwide federation of national standards bodies (ISO member bodies). This second edition cancels and replaces the first edition (ISO 4824:1981) of which it constitutes a technical revision, differing in the following respects.

- a) The title has been modified to include other ceramics in addition to porcelain.
- b) A statement concerning the addition of fluorescing agents has been added.

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
