Foreword

ISO (the International Organization for Standardization) is a worldwide federation of national standards bodies (ISO member bodies). Each member body interested in a subject for which a technical committee has been established has the right to be represented on that committee. International Standard ISO 7253 was prepared by Technical Committee ISO/TC 35, *Paints and varnishes*, Subcommittee SC 9, *General test methods for paints and varnishes*.

This second edition cancels and replaces the first edition (ISO 7253:1984) of which it constitutes a technical revision. The main changes are:

- a) the addition of a calibration procedure to check the corrosivity within the apparatus;
- b) more details have been given on the preparation of the scratches to be applied to the panels.

Annexes A, B and C are an integral part of this International Standard.

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
